



Approaching an Academic Assignment

1. Break down the assignment question/brief

- Understand what are you **generally** being asked to read and write about
- Identify the **focus** of the assignment

2. Get organised

- **Plan backwards** from your deadline so think about the **resources** you may require to complete your assignment

3. Read strategically

- **Be selective** when reading to help make sure you incorporate relevant information into your work – speak with your [Academic Liaison Librarian](#)

- [_____](#) for guidance
- **Skim** read the text first to decide whether it relates to your assignment
- Read over **the relevant sections** in detail and make notes at the same time

4. Be an active note-maker

- **Be specific** about how the point you are writing down relates to your assignment
